#### **CALENDAR**

Looking ahead to next year:

- the Triodion begins with the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee on 13 February;
- Meatfare Sunday, the last day of eating meat until Pascha, is on 27 February;
- Cheesefare week begins on Monday 28 February;
- Cheesefare (Forgiveness) Sunday is on 6 March and the following day, Monday 7 March) is the first day of Great Lent;
- Palm Sunday is on 17 April;
- Pascha, the Bright Resurrection of Christ (Easter Day) is on 24 April.

#### PATRONAL FEAST & FOUNDER'S DAY

On Saturday 6 November, we had our Patronal Feast for the Ikon *Joy of All Who Sorrow* which culminated in a procession around the church and a moleben infront of the Ikon. After communion everyone was anointed with holy oil from the lampada which burns in front of the original Wonderworking Ikon in Moscow. Finally, a special greeting was read from Bishop Irenei by Fr Antony, greeting all parishioners on this special feast.

After a break of two years, due to the disruption of the pandemic, Founder's Day (11th anniversary of the repose of the Foundress, of blessed memory) was held on Monday 15 November, with a requiem liturgy in the collegiate church, prayers at the tomb and the memorial meal in the college dining room. In past years, this has been a well-attended event but, this year, the turnout was much reduced. Clearly it will take more time to recover from the recent fears and restrictions.

### MARINA (CAROLINE) LOCK

We were saddened to hear of the repose of our dear friend Marina (Caroline) Lock of Walsingham on Monday 22 November after a valiant battle with cancer. Marina was well known and loved by many members of our community and was a regular visitor to the church particularly over Holy Week services and key events and would often join the choir on the kliros. Late on Sunday afternoon on 28 November a pannikhida was served for the repose of her soul and a number of us hope to travel to Walsingham for her funeral on Monday 13 December at the Parish of the Transfiguration in Walsingham at Noon. Our deepest condolences go to Marina's husband, Cennydd, who devotedly cared for Marina in her final months. May her Memory be Eternal!
