DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO ST ALBAN'S

As usual, we were able, during the moleben, to venerate the relics of the saint, which were finally returned to the cathedral several years ago. The event was very well attended, not only by members of ROCOR, but by many from other jurisdictions as well, and it was estimated that there were nearly two hundred people in total. As well as attending the services, the Faithful also enjoyed being in the pleasant environs of the cathedral, and the somewhat changeable weather held out for long enough to enable our usual outdoor lunch.

PASCHAL IKON

Over the years many ikon cards have been published. The Paschal Ikon, Descent into Hades, was popular as a greeting card. The print-run is now completely exhausted. That ikon (we never had the original) was produced by St Seraphim's Studio in Walsingham. Now, we've taken the

decision to commission a new Paschal ikon, from Efrem Carrasco, for our church. This will be photographed and published as a card, hopefully in time for Easter next year.

WEBSITE

Apologies are due to any customers who have tried to order various titles through our website, only to discover that they are no longer available. When we first started selling books in the 1970s, things were very different. These were pre-internet days and people in this country found it difficult to get books, many of which were published in America. Now we are obliged to rethink the whole strategy of book-selling. No decisions have yet been taken. Whilst we do not want to stop stocking books, it is necessary to find a way to do this that makes economic sense. For the most part, we only stock ikon cards that we actually publish. This means we control the availability. In addition to the Paschal ikon, the ikon card of Christ with six local saints and the Our Lady of Walsingham card are currently out of print.


