

GLASTONBURY THORN

As many people know, there is an ancient tradition in England that St Joseph of Arimathea travelled here very soon after the Crucifixion. It is said that, when he arrived, he planted his staff in the ground and it grew into a thorn tree. This tree was unusual, in that it bloomed not only once in spring, but also a second time at Christmas. Sadly, the original thorn, like so many of our ancient relics, was destroyed at the Reformation, but by that time the tree had been widely propagated, and we have been kindly gifted a tree which is descended from it. The tree was donated by Dr and Mrs Macmillan of Stroud, Father Deacon Mark's sister and brother-in-law. It has been planted outside the church, on the right-hand side of the path leading to the Foundress' grave. We are very grateful for this special gift.



RECEPTION OF CATECHUMENS

To the great joy of everyone in the community, in the week following the Sunday of the Prodigal Son, our two catechumens were received into the Church. Nicholas Matthewson, was received through baptism on Tuesday 26 February at our cathedral in London, and Mary (Sue) Bastin was received through chrismation on Saturday 2 March. Nicholas was named for St Nicholas of Myra, and Mary for St Mary of Egypt. They then received their first Holy Communion together at the Divine Liturgy on the Sunday of the Last Judgment, Sunday 3 March. Bishop Irenei sent his warmest congratulations.
