College Renovations and the Church

Work did begin of the external renovations in July but this was interrupted by the builder's summer holidays. Consequently progress has been slow. Like so many things here, it can be designated *work in progress*. Two years ago, the original wooden cross on the main cupola was replaced by a splendid stainless steel cross made, installed and donated by Tim Le Vin. More recently, the cross on the smaller cupola over the altar needed replacing. Tim has made a stainless steel replacement to match the large cross and will install it when he returns from holiday at the end of this month.

Christmas Cards

Two new Christmas card designs are currently being printed. One is an ikon of St Nicholas of Myra from the hand of Archimandrite David of St Seraphim's Studio at Walsingham. We often hear about "Father Christmas" being based on St Nicholas but why would we bother with an imposter when we had the great hierarch himself. The other subject is inspired by Holy Trinity – St Sergius Lava and is an original piece of artwork by Anna Moore. These will be sold in packs of 5 cards, with envelopes, retailing at £1.50 per pack. The advertising will be prepared during September and will include many previously published designs.

"Faithless Generation"

In the first millennium, the great saints of these islands thought they had rid our land of erroneous and false beliefs. Sadly, this process went into reverse in the 11th Century when our ancestors found themselves on the wrong side of the Great Schism. The following is an example that many people might not have noticed. Each morning at about 5.40am on Radio 4 there is slot called "Prayer for the Day". The speakers are drawn from various backgrounds, but they are mostly clergy persons, who would describe themselves as Christians. The format is a couple a minutes of general introduction about the chosen subject leading into a seemingly extemporary prayer. Usually, this prayer is addressed, non-specifically, to *Living God*, or some similar sobriquet. *Christ* is never mentioned. Indeed, this is so consistent that it tempts one to ask if the word has been banned by the editors at the BBC. Recently, one speaker was a Scottish Presbyterian minister, whose subject was the religious significance of dancing. He addressed his prayer to *Great Love*.

Our great saints laboured with and for Christ, the Lord. Miracles were wrought through their efforts. It will take a major miracle to reverse the spiritual decline of these formerly Christian islands, but such an aspiration should not be absent from our prayers.
