A Pastoral Word from Fr Mark

GIFTS TO THE CHURCH

There has always existed an ancient custom for the laity to provide the bread itself or the finest flour for the prosphora to be baked as well as sweet red wine and olive oil that are used in church services. If God inspires you to donate these items, please find some guidance to help you. For the flour, please purchase **Very Strong White Bread Flour** (we often use Allinson's Bread Flour which is widely available). For the wine, this can't just be any red wine, but needs to be sweet red wine. We tend to use **Mavrodaphne of Patra** which again is widely available in most supermarkets. Finally, for oil, please purchase **ordinary Olive oil**, rather than Vegetable or Corn oil, though this should be the cheaper olive oil rather than Extra-Virgin.

APPROACHING FEASTS AND HOLY DAYS

Our Orthodox life is not limited to Sundays, but it something we live out everyday and also involves a level of sacrifice and forward planning. Please start planning now and liaising with your employer so that you will be fully able to participate in the key services of Holy Week. In Holy Week itself, as with Clean Week, there will be services in the church every day. I would advise taking off Holy Thursday 13 April where in the morning we will serve the Vesperal Liturgy of St John Chrysostom and commemorate our Saviour's Last Supper with his disciples; and in the evening we will serve the Matins Service of the 12 Gospels before the Cross. At an absolute minimum, all Orthodox Christians should take off Great and Holy Friday 14 April as this is the most solemn fast day of the entire church calendar. We will serve the Royal Hours in the morning followed by Vespers and Matins in the afternoon and evening during which the Shroud of Christ will be brought out of the Altar and venerated by the faithful. Fortunately, for Suffolk schools at least, Holy Week falls within the Easter Holiday so I expect and hope to see many children in church over these holy days. A Bank Holiday has also been generously given to us this year, which should enable all of us to be free for the Feast of the Annunciation of the Theotokos on Friday 7 April.

WEEKLY MOLEBEN TO THE THEOTOKOS & FURTHER LENTEN SERVICES

It has been good to see some people attending our Great Compline Services during the first week of Great Lent. Please note that we will also be serving the **Akathist to the Theotokos on Fridays** throughout Great Lent at 7.30pm and I am also hoping to learn how to serve the Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts. Please look at the service schedule carefully so you don't miss any of the extra services. If I am able to learn the Liturgy of the Presanctified I will also advertise any additional times when this will be served, most likely on a Wednesday early evening.

BRIGHT FRIDAY IN WALSINGHAM

Subject to a blessing from Vladyka, Hieromonk Mark, who is the priest in charge of the ROCOR presence at the Shrine of Walsingham has asked if I can serve the Liturgy for the Altar Feast of the Shrine Chapel on **Friday 21 April**.
