#### REGULAR OFFERTORY GIFTS TO THE CHURCH

Just a reminder that the parish is always in need of regular staples to enable the Liturgy and services to function. We would be particularly grateful for donations of the following -



#### Mavrodaphne of Patra Sweet Red Wine

This is the Communion wine that we use at Mettingham. It costs between £6 - £7 per bottle. We are generally using approximately 3 bottles per month.

#### Olive Oil (not extra-virgin)

This is the cleanest and best oil to use in the lamps. This doesn't need to be especially expensive olive oil and supermarket own-brand bottles are quite acceptable.

#### • Spring Water (1.5 – 21 bottles)

We use fresh spring water for the hot water that is used for zapivka as well as in the chalice. Again, this doesn't need to be especially expensive spring water and can be supermarket own-brand.

#### ST BOTOLPH'S PILGRIMAGE

With the blessing of Bishop Irenei, on Saturday 24th June, it was a great joy to resume our annual pilgrimage to St Botolph's church in Iken following the pandemic. Concelebrating at the moleben with Fr Mark and Deacon Andrew was Fr Evgeny Selensky, from the Sourozh Diocese, and Fr Mark Shillaker from St Helen's Parish in Colchester. It was wonderful to see that the church was full with pilgrims coming from as far as Telford, Peterborough and Walsingham. After singing the Akathist to the saint, the faithful were able to venerate the parish's beautiful icon of St Botolph as well as a reliquary of different saints which had been kindly gifted earlier in the day by the ikonographer George Ioannou who was also present at the service. After the pilgrims had had the chance to venerate the ikon, relics as well as the ancient Anglo-saxon cross shaft at the back of the church, they were then invited to the home of the church warden Louise Cooke who provided a generous buffet lunch. This gave the weary pilgrims time to talk to each other in Louise's beautiful grounds with its stunning views across the River Alde. Particular thanks to Louise and Paul Cooke for their wonderful hospitality. The parish hope to return to Iken again next year on or around the last Saturday in June.
