

# A Pastoral Word from Fr Mark

#### LITURGY FOR ST VARUS

As reported in the October bulletin, the new ikon which Fr Mark commissioned from the ikonographer Efrem Carrasco has now arrived and will be placed permanently somewhere next to the table for the departed. This will enable those praying for the repose of the souls of departed non-Orthodox Christians to direct their prayers to the Martyr Varus and to venerate his ikon. On **Wednesday 1**st **November**, a liturgy was served for the Martyr Varus and St John of Kronstadt and the new ikon of the saint was blessed. At the end of the Divine Liturgy, the Prayer to St Varus was read and Fr Mark silently commemorated the names of non-Orthodox departed.

## TIME OF WEDNESDAY MOLEBEN TO CHANGE TO 7.30pm

As Fr Mark still works over 30hrs per week for Suffolk County Council, on the occasions where he needs to work on a Wednesday this makes it very difficult for him to get to church in time. Thus from November, the time of our regular moleben on **Wednesdays** will now shift from 6.30pm to 7.30pm. Over the past few months we have had molebens and akathists to: St Tikhon; St Cyril and Maria, parents of St Sergius; St Columba, Fathers of Optina, St Aidan and St Elizabeth. Fr Mark would also be very happy to have requests for molebens to different saints.

# Notes & Jottings

#### TRUSTEE MEETING

At the Trustee Meeting on Sunday 29th October, as well as approving the accounts for 2022, a number of improvements to the property and church were discussed. The trustees agreed on the need for improvement to external lighting to make it safer for parishioners returning to their cars in the evening. This will probably take the form of two lamp posts at the car park and on the way to the car park as well as motion-sensored lighting on the front façade of the House. Following confirmation from the Broads Authority, we are also looking to place a prominent sign at the entrance to the property which will hopefully make it easier for visitors to find the church and not to be confused by the lack of any obvious church building in the front of the grounds. The sign will also have a window where we can put up the monthly services list. Further improvements include making the disabled ramp to the North door properly non-slip and to enable wheel-chairs to pass through the door much easier. We are also looking to purchase a cardless reader for the church especially as the use of cash in society continues to diminish.

#### PANIKHIDA AND CHURCH CLEAN

Thank you to Nicholas, Daniel, Irinia, Daniel, Inge and her grandchildren as well as George and Matushka Elizabeth who all came to pray for the departed at a Panikhida on Demetrius Saturday. After the panikhida, everyone helped with getting the church spick and span for our patronal feast and founders day, so that the church positively sparkled inside and out.

#### GIFT OF OIL AND INCENSE

Thanks are due to Alla and John Steel for gifting to the church incense and oil from their trip to the famous churches and monasteries of Kefalonia in Greece where the mysterious warm-blooded snakes appear each year around the Feast of the Dormition.

#### **WILLOW TREE**

The willow tree that was mentioned in the last bulletin has now had to be felled completely following more branches coming down. Its removal also makes possible the expansion of the car parking area. This could provide a significant increase in the capacity for parked cars that could be especially useful at Pascha.

### **IKONOSTASIS**

For many years the church has had real ikons in the Deacon doors and Royal doors but we have been without a formal ikonostasis which would normally be seen in an Orthodox Church. Over the past month or so, early conversations have taken place with Silouan (Dylan) Hartley of our ROCOR parish in Telford and we are now looking to commission the construction of a wooden ikonostasis as well as further painted ikons from the iconographer Efrem Carrasco. This has become more urgent as the Deacon Doors in particular have unfortunately started to warp which could, in the longer term, lead to the ikons themselves becoming damaged. We hope to present a plan of the future ikonostasis shortly.
